
Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Our focus for this week leading up to Easter is Solidarity. Solidarity is the act of standing on the side of those who most need our help. It differs from charity in that we are called to DO something to change the situation rather than give to help a person. When systems are unjust we are all called to speak up and make a stand for what is right.

This week students are preparing for their Easter Story... We take all the students through the Stations of the Cross to teach them about the death and resurrection of Jesus. Each class prepares one station and shares this with the rest of the school. It is always a very moving liturgy and gives us all a sense of what it is Jesus has done in order that we have life and have it to the full. We know Easter is much more than the commercial idea of chocolate and Easter eggs. Whilst it is lovely for children to receive them we would encourage you to make sure you talk to them about the real meaning of this season... the life, death and resurrection of Jesus.

This term you will have all developed goals for your child's learning. These goals are set alongside the goals your child has for themselves and the goals the teacher has for them. We know only too well that learning is a partnership. None of us can learn on our own, we need to talk about our learning, share our learning with others and get support when we need it.

Last year we introduced the learning partnership model and you were all happy to identify what it is you will do to help your child achieve their goals. This partnership is a four way partnership as in this model below:



This week teachers are preparing the student/ peer and teacher sections. A copy will then be sent home for you to complete the parent section. This will be used for you to review at learning conversations later in the year.
