Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Our theme for this fortnight has been self-control. We know that this is a critical skill for children and adults alike. We have focused on the meaning of self-control – taking time to think before we act, before we speak and before we react. We all make choices and we are responsible for those choices...yes even children and yes even very young children. We encourage our students to take personal responsibility – it is important that you as their parents do the same. When things happen at school – and make no mistake things happen – it is a valuable opportunity to talk to your child about their reaction, their choice and their words. We are not accepting of the statement – "He made me do it" She made me angry". These statements are about relinquishing personal responsibility. When you talk with them be careful that you do not take on their battle without seeking clarification about the incident. If you need to talk to someone at school then please do so respectfully as you are a role model for your child and they look to you to see how to resolve issues they may face.

You may be aware that the Minister of Education is currently reviewing the funding processes for schools. You may have heard in the media two perspectives on this debate. There are also many other statements being made in particular the idea of COOLs, an online learning school and the change to the way in which special needs funding is allocated. I would recommend that you take time to read the material and familiarise yourself with these developments. These are some of the most significant changes to how schools are funded and will most certainly have an effect on our communities. Further details will be shared with all staff at their paid union meeting. This has been called by the PPTA (Secondary) and NZEI (Primary) unions. It is significant that these two unions have joined together to explore this proposal. We understand the challenge of these meetings however they are only called in school time when the issues is of significant concern. We appreciate your support in making sure we know what this funding proposal means for each and every one of your children in our care.

Attached to this newsletter is the advice that all staff will be attending a stopwork meeting on THURSDAY 8<sup>th</sup> September.

## **ACCOUNTS 2016**

We have 284 students at St Claudine's. We rely on payment being made on time in order for us to manage our finances and accounts. Thank you to all of those families who have paid their accounts and those who have regular automatic payments set up to cover costs.

To date we have a total of 110 students fully paid 72 students on Automatic Payment HOWEVER:

There are 102 students for whom nothing has been paid. This is a total of \$21,000 outstanding. If you are having difficulty please let us know as soon as possible.

All other accounts are due to be paid in full by 25 November and unpaid accounts at this stage will be followed up by the bursar.
