It is a beautiful tribute to the Catholic- Samoan tradition with a most amazing centre piece dome which depicts the last supper – Jesus and his disciples are dressed in ie layalava with the traditional Pe'a (tattoo). The singing at the fia fia night was outstanding and reinforced how important this group is in the context of our school. Hello my name is Shirley Hay and I am the convenor for the Wainuiomata Golf Club's Junior Coaching Programme. Can you please let your students and their parents know about our junior golf coaching programme which starts from Tuesday 11 October 2016.

- 1. Coaching takes place **every Tuesday between 5 and 6pm** at the Wainuiomata Golf Course which is on the Coast Road.
- The first session will be on Tuesday 11 October 2016.
- 3. The age range is for children from 6 years to 13 years.
- 4. The coaching is done by qualified volunteers and we also have assistance from a professional golf coach (Dean Kingsbeer).
- 5. **It is free** and all equipment is provided.

The coaching is structured to introduce golf to beginners in an environment which is fun and safe.

- 1. For beginners we use plastic clubs and tennis balls.
- 2. For the more advanced and for juniors who have had previous coaching we use real golf clubs and balls.

WAINUIOMATA AMATEUR SWIMMING CLUB


