


Week Eight Term One Thursday 29 March 2018

Sight word recognition, spelling, bingo, memory, and flash cards for basic sight words.

Tap the word to hear it, then use your finger to trace and write the word. You can also record yourself reading the word.

Number recognition and addition/subtraction facts to 5.



Maths with Springbird

Addition and subtraction within 20. With every correct answer the bird jumps higher up the tree to unlock new features.

Counting, skip counting, numbers to 100, matching objects to given number, and addition/subtraction. This app is great because it allows you

to track your child's progress and identify areas for further development.

Counting to 10, number sequences, number patterns, and addition to 10.
