### Changes to 10-trip tickets used on Classic Coach school buses in

#### <u>Wainuiomata</u>

**From Sunday 17 June 2018**, Snapper will replace 10-trip tickets on the school bus services in Wainuiomata. If you buy a 10-trip ticket before 17 June, you will still be able to use this until 30 June 2018. The alternative for students using Metlink buses is to pay using a Snapper card with a Child Concession applied. Your school bus will be Metlink lime and yellow.
